RHPS Visits the Montclair Historic Center

The Society visited the Montclair Historic Center, located at 110 Orange Road in Montclair, Essex County, New Jersey

The Montclair Historic Center features the "Israel Crane House" and Historic YWCA, a federal-style home. This home was built in 1796 by 21-year old Israel Crane for his wife Fanny Crane and remained in the Crane Family for over 100 years. In 1920, the home was purchased by a group of African American women in the community as the headquarters for a YWCA and was a significant part of the African American community for four decades. By 1965, local preservationists moved the house to its present location and turned it into a historic house museum. The house has a rich history and was added to the National Register of Historic Places on March 14, 1973, for its significance in architecture.

Also located at the Historic Center is The Nathaniel Crane House which was built in 1818 by Captain Nathaniel Crane, Jr., Israel Crane's cousin. Captain Nathaniel Crane, Jr. was a militiaman and patriot from Essex County. Today, the Nathaniel Crane House serves as the visitor's center for the Montclair Historic Center. The first floor displays an exhibit of a nineteenth century general store much like the one owned by Israel Crane in the early nineteenth century. On the second floor, there is an exhibit featuring a nineteenth century schoolroom illustrating nineteenth century education in Montclair.
